REMARKS

COUNCILMAN RAY MOTIONED TO REQUEST TO PERMIT BARB EWING FROM THE YOUNGSTOWN BUSINESS INCUBATOR TO SPEAK BEFORE CITY COUNCIL.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS SECONDED.

MS. EWING REQUESTED A SUPPORT LETTER FOR \$1.35 MILLION FOR THE YOUNGSTOWN INNOVATION HUB FOR DEFENSE AND AEROSPACE PROJECT.

COUNCILMAN RAY ASKED THE MAYOR AND MR. MIASEK IF THE CITY CAN SUPPORT THE \$1.35 MILLION REQUEST FROM YBI AND RECOMMEND THAT COUNCIL APPROVE.

MR. MIASEK ANSWERED YES, THEY WILL BE BRINGING LEGISLATION FOR THE NEXT COUNCIL MEETING TO PROPOSE THE FUNDING FOR THE NEXT FOUR YEARS OF THE AMOUNT THAT MS. EWING SPOKE ABOUT.

MAYOR BROWN STATED HE WILL BE PROVIDING A LETTER OF COMMITMENT THAT WILL GO ALONG WITH THE GRANT SO THAT THEY KNOW THE CITY IS COMMITTING TO IT.

COUNCILMAN RAY ASKED IF IT IS HELPFUL FOR CITY COUNCIL TO PROVIDE A LETTER OF COMMITMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE LEGISLATION.

MAYOR BROWN ANSWERED YES.

COUNCILMAN RAY REQUESTED THAT THE CLERK DRAFT A LETTER FROM COUNCIL SUPPORTING THE \$1.35 MILLION DOLLAR LEGISLATION MIRRORING WHAT THE MAYOR WILL BE PREPARING.

MS. EWING STATED THEY ARE ON TRACK TO SEE THE FULL \$1.3 MILLION DOLLARS BY A CONSIDERABLE AMOUNT. A LOT OF THAT IS THROUGH CONTRIBUTIONS AND SUPPORT FROM CORPORATIONS FOR THINGS LIKE SOFTWARE AND PIECES OF EQUIPMENT. THEY DO FEEL THE NEED TO OVERMATCH BECAUSE THE PROPOSAL NEEDS TO BE BULLET PROOF.

MAYOR BROWN NOTED THE LETTER IS NEEDED BY FRIDAY.

COUNCILMAN RAY ASKED SPEAKER PATRICIA DUNBAR (COM-24-247) QUESTIONS RELATED TO SOBE'S LACK OF TRIAL BURNS. IF THE TRIAL BURNS ARE A PART OF THE PERMITTING PROCESS.

MS. DUNBAR RESPONDED THAT THE TRIAL BURN WAS INITIALLY COMPLETED AS PART OF THE PERMITTING PROCESS SO THAT THEY KNEW WHAT THE TEMPERATURES WERE AND THE WEIGHT OF INCINERATION; ALL OF THOSE WERE PERMITTING CONDITIONS. THAT IS ANOTHER REASON WHY SHE WAS SURPRISED THE OHIO EPA ISSUED A PERMIT WITHOUT A TRIAL BURN OF ANY KIND TO SEE WHAT THE PERMITTING CONDITIONS WOULD BE.

COUNCILMAN RAY ASKED IF THEY DO A SIMILAR BURN TRIALS ANNUALLY.

MS. DUNBAR ANSWERED YES. AFTER THE INITIAL CONDITIONS ARE SET THEY HAVE TO ANNUALLY DO ANOTHER TEST BURN. FOR THESE TEST BURNS THEY ALREADY KNOW WHAT THE COMPOSITION IS; THEY RUN THEM AT HIGH, MINIMUM, AND MAXIMUM CONDITIONS TO SEE IF THERE ARE ERRORS THAT OCCUR. SHE STATED NONE OF THIS HAS BEEN PROPOSED FOR S.O.B.E. AND IS INTERESTED TO KNOW WHY.

COUNCILMAN RAY INQUIRED IF THE INCINERATORS HAVE SIMS EQUIPMENT ON THEM AS HE DOES NOT BELIEVE IT WAS REQUIRED FOR THIS S.O.B.E. SCENARIO.

MS. DUNBAR RESPONDED THAT IS CORRECT AND SHE WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHY. PART OF IT IS THAT THE TIRES ARE NOT CONSIDERED HAZARDOUS WASTE, ALTHOUGH THEY HAVE HAZERDOUS CONSTITUENTS AND THE BYPRODUCTS THAT WILL BE RELEASED AS A RESULT OF THE PROCESS ARE DEFINITELY THE FURANS, ACID GASES, NITROGEN OXIDE, AND ALL OF THE MATERIALS THAT WILL BE PRODUCED AS A RESULT OF COMBUSTION IN THE PYROLYSIS PROCESS. THEY DO NOT HAVE ANY RECORD OF THAT AND THEY HAVE NOT TESTED IT. SHE WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHY, AND THIS WOULD BE A GOOD QUESTION TO ASK THE STATE OF OHIO.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS ASKED **MS. DUNBAR** IF SHE IS AWARE OF THIS PROCESS BEING USED IN OTHER COUNTRIES PARTICULARLY IN AFRICA WHERE THEY ARE BURNING TIRES OUT IN THE OPEN AND THIS TYPE OF PROCESS IS BEING UTILIZED.

MS. DUNBAR ANSWERED SHE IS NOT AWARE. HOWEVER, SHE IS ALSO CURIOUS THAT THERE'S THESE KINDS OF FACILITIES IN THE UNITED STATES THAT HAVE BEEN PROPOSED. INITIALLY THERE WERE 11 AND NOW THEY ARE DOWN TO 9 BUT ARE NOT FULLY OPERATING FOR SOME REASON. THESE TESTS HAVE TO BE COMPLETED FOR THE PROTECTION OF HUMAN HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT WHICH IS THE EPA'S MISSION STATEMENT.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ASKED **MS. BUERK (COM-24-248)** IF SHE WAS RECOMMENDING A TWO-YEAR MORATORIUM AS THAT IS SOMETHING THAT IS HAPPENING ACROSS THE STATE.

MS. BUERK ANSWERED THAT A 12-MONTH MORATORIUM WOULD BE SUFFICIENT. THE MORATORIUM SITED WAS RENEWED TWICE EACH TIME FOR 12-MONTHS. THAT EXTENSION IS REASONABLE TO ACCOMPLISH COUNCIL'S GOAL TO FURTHER RESEARCH PYROLYSIS. IF IN THE FUTURE A RENEWAL IS NEEDED THAT CASE INDICATES THAT IS AN OPTION.

PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL INDICATED THAT COUNCILMAN OLIVER, COUNCILMAN RAY, COUNCILMAN KELLY, AND COUNCILWOMAN TURNER REQUESTED TO BE ADDED AS CO-SPONSORS TO ITEM #2 (ORD-24-437) UNDER ORDINANCES.

REMARKS

MR. MIASEK ASKED IF THE LEGISLATION WOULD TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY WITH SIX VOTES TO SUSPEND THE RULES OF COINCIL AFTER BEING SENT TO A THIRD READING AND IT IS PASSED BY COUNCIL.

PRESIDENT OF COUNCIL ANSWERED YES, IT WILL TAKE EFFECT IMMEDIATELY IF THERE'S SIX VOTES TO SUSPEND THE RULES OF COUNCIL.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ASKED HOW MANY OF THOSE RESOURCES COULD BE USED TOWARDS THE HIRING LIST BEFORE THE END OF YEAR AND BEFORE THE BONUSES.

MR. MIASEK STATED THAT ORIGINALLY THE WINDOW OF THE GRANT WAS DECEMBER 2024. WHEN THEY SPOKE TO THEM THE STATE WAS WILLING TO EXTEND IT FOR ANOTHER YEAR. FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE YEAR THE CITY WOULD BE REIMBURSED FOR THE NINE OFFICERS THAT ARE CURRENTLY BEING PAID FOR BY THE GRANT FOR THE THIRD AND FOURTH QUARTER OF 2024. TO PREVENT MONIES BEING RETURNED OR BE IN JEAPORDY OF HAVING TO RETURN FUNDS, THE BEST APPROACH WAS TO UNDER THE GUIDELINES, TO PROVIDE A 10% BONUS TO THE OFFICERS AS OUTLINED IN THE GRANT.

MAYOR BROWN INDICATED THEY WILL LOOK TO SEE IF THE NEXT FIVE ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THAT. HE CAUTIONED THAT THE FUNDING MAY NOT BE AVAILABLE IN 2025 DUE TO ADMINISTRATION CHANGES SO THEY WANTED TO CAPTURE THIS AND UTILIZE THE FUNDS TO THE BEST OF THEIR ABILITIES.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS ASKED POLICE CHIEF DAVIS IF HE WILL BE HIRING THE FIVE OFFICERS BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR.

POLICE CHIEF DAVIS RESPONDED THAT IS THE GOAL.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS INQUIRED IF REALISTICALLY DO THEY EXPECT TO ADD A FEW MORE OFFICERS BEFORE THE END OF THE YEAR.

POLICE CHIEF DAVIS ANSWERED THAT HE HOPES SO, IF THERE ARE NO ISSUES WITH BACKGROUND CHECKS AND CURRENTLY IT IS STILL A PROCESS.

COUNCILMAN RAY ASKED COUNCILWOMAN TURNER IF SHE WOULD RECONSIDER VOTING IN FAVOR OF THE SUSPENSION OF THE RULES TO PASS THIS LEGISLATION IF SHE IS SATISFIED WITH THEIR RESPONSES.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ANSWERED NO.

MR. MIASEK STATED THE ORIGINAL PLAN WAS TO BE FULLY REIMBURSED FOR THE NINE OFFICERS. THEY CAN SET ASIDE FUNDS TO COVER FIVE AND AT THE END OF THE FOURTH QUARTER THAT IS ALL THEY WILL IDENTIFY TO THE STATE FOR REIMBURSEMENT. THE ONLY DRAWBACK IS THAT THEY WILL NEED TO BE

ON THE PAYROLL FOR 2024 IN ORDER TO DO THAT. IF THEY ARE NOT HIRED, THE FUNDS WILL NOT BE ABLE TO BE PAID OUT IN 2025 BUT WILL USE THOSE FUNDS THAT WERE NOT USED TOWARDS REIMBURSEMENT IF THEY ARE NOT HIRED. HE ASKED IF THAT MEETS THE NEEDS OF COUNCIL AS A WHOLE.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ASKED POLICE CHIEF DAVIS IF HE WILL HAVE A HANDLE ON IF THESE FIVE WILL BE ON THE PAYROLL BY THE END OF THE YEAR.

POLICE CHIEF DAVIS ANSWERED YES.

MR. MIASEK SAID IT WOULD BE IN OUR BEST INTEREST FOR COUNCIL TO RECONSIDER THEIR VOTE TO MAKE IT EASIER TO INFORM THE STATE ON THE PLANS ON HOW WE WILL UTILIZE THE FUNDS AND MEET THEIR DEADLINE.

COUNCILMAN HUGHES INQUIRED ABOUT THE PENSION MATCH.

MR. MIASEK RESPONDED THAT WHATEVER REQUIREMENT IS IN THE PENSION BASED ON WHAT WE GENERATE FOR THE BONUS WE WILL MAKE THE PENSION PAYMENT. ANY DIFFERENCE WE WILL ADJUST IT FROM WHAT WE IDENTIFY AS REIMBURSEMENT FOR THE NINE OFFICERS IN THE LAST QUARTER OF 2024.

COUNCILMAN HUGHES COMMENTED THAT BONUSES ARE NOT NORMALLY AN ALLOWABLE.

MR. MIASEK RESPONDED THAT IS THE NORMAL PROCESS. POLICE AND FIRE HAVE CHANGED THEIR VIEW AND ARE REQUIRING THOSE PENSIONS TO BE PAID BY THE COMMUNITY. THAT IS WHY THE LEGISLATION ASKS FOR COUNCIL TO MAKE THOSE CHANGES.

COUNCILMAN RAY INDICATED THE LEGISLATION WILL NEED TO GO TO A SECOND READING EVEN THOUGH THERE IS OVERWHELMING SUPPORT.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS NOTED SHE SUPPORTS THE LEGISLATION BUT IT IS NOT OVERWHELMING. SHE IS TAKING THE LIEUTENANTS WORD THAT IF WE DIVIDE IT EQUALLY, IT WILL PUT THEM OVER THE 10% AMOUNT.

UPON MOTION OF MR. RAY, THE ORDINANCE WAS **MOVED TO A SECOND READING.**


