COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS ASKED PUBLIC WORKS DIRECTOR CHARLES SHASHO IF THIS LEGISLATION WAS JUST FOR THE REMOVAL OF OLD LAMP POLES.

MR. SHASHO ANSWERED THAT ITEM NUMBERS 15 AND 16 ON THE AGENDA ARE FOR THE REMOVAL OF FIRST ENERGY OWNED STEEL LIGHT POLES ON FRONT STREET FOR THE SMART2 NETWORK. SIMILAR LEGISLATION WILL COME FOR REMOVAL OF LIGHT POLES ON COMMERCE STREET, FEDERAL STREET AND RAYEN AVENUE. THE LIGHTS GOING UP ARE SIMILAR TO ONES ON WICK AVENUE AND FIFTH AVENUE, AND THERE IS A TIMELINESS FACTOR.

PRESIDENT HETRICK *NOTED THAT COUNCILMAN HUGHES HAS JOINED THE MEETING.

REMARKS

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS THANKED THE CITY FOR THE SNOW REMOVAL EFFORTS.

COUNCILWOMAN MCNALLY ALSO THANKED KEVIN FLINN FOR THE SNOW REMOVAL RESPONSE.

COUNCILMAN. RAY NOTED THERE IS A SNOW PLOW TRACKER AVAILABLE ON THE CITY'S WEBSITE.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER STATED SHE VOTED NO ON SOME OF THE ITEMS AS SHE WAS UNABLE TO ATTEND THE FINANCE COMMITTEE MEETING TO DISCUSS THEM IN DEPTH. HER STREET WAS NOT PLOWED UNTIL TUESDAY NIGHT AND SHE COULD NOT GET OUT. SOME OF HER CONSTITUENTS LOST PAY AS THEY COULD NOT GET TO WORK, AND SHE HOPES SNOW REMOVAL GETS BETTER IN THE FUTURE.

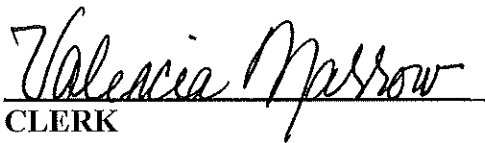
COUNCILMAN HUGHES NOTED THAT THE SENIOR CITIZENS IN HIS WARD CANNOT UTILIZE THE WEBSITE WELL TO USE THE SNOW PLOW TRACKER. *(UNINTELLGIBLE STATEMENTS)*.

COUNCILMAN OLIVER ALSO COMMENDED THE CITY STREET DEPARTMENT, AND NOTED WE DON'T HAVE THE STAFF THE SUBURBS AND TOWNSHIPS HAVE.

MR. SHASHO ADDED THAT THE COUNTY ENGINEER AND ODOT DO ALL OF THE MAIN ROADS OF THE TOWNSHIPS, SO THEY ONLY HAVE TO FOCUS ON THE SIDE ROADS. THE CITY HAS TO DO ALL OF THE ROADS, AND ALL OF THE ROADS WERE CLEAR WITHIN 48 HOURS OF THE SNOW STOPPING. THEY ALSO HAULED TENS OF THOUSANDS OF TONS OF SNOW OUT OF THE DOWNTOWN AREA WITH THE HELP OF MULTIPLE DEPARTMENTS AND CONTRACTORS, SO IT WAS A TEAM EFFORT.

UPON MOTION COUNCIL ADJOURNED
