PUBLIC COMMENTS

PUBLIC COMMENT: SUBMITTED BY MR. & MRS. MINOR, RESIDENTS OF THE 6TH WARD ON PINEHURST AVENUE. ON AUGUST 19, 2020 AT APPROXIMATELY 4:00 AM, THEY WERE AWAKENED BY THE SOUND OF WATER IN THEIR BASEMENT, AND AS IT WAS NOT RAINING, THEY SEARCHED THE HOUSE AND FOUND 4 FEET OF STANDING WATER, SEWAGE AND MUD IN THE BASEMENT. THEY CONTACTED THEIR INSURANCE COMPANY OF 20 YEARS, HOWEVER THEY REFUSED TO COVER DAMAGES BECAUSE THEY DETERMINED IT WAS CAUSED BY THE CITY OF YOUNGSTOWN'S WORK ON A WATERLINE A FEW STREETS AWAY. COSTS THEY INCURRED INCLUDE: \$900 FOR A FURNACE, \$10,666.49 FOR THE CLEAN-UP FROM SERV-PRO, AND \$1,602.32 TO PURCHASE A NEW FREEZER, WASHER AND DRYER; FOR A TOTAL OF \$13,168.81 WORTH OF DAMAGES RESULTING FROM THE FLOODING CAUSED BY THE CITY OF YOUNGSTOWN DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS. THEY ARE LIFELONG CITIZENS OF THE CITY OF YOUNGSTOWN AND HAVE RESIDED AT 29 PINEHURST FOR OVER 20 YEARS; AND THEY WOULD LIKE ASSURANCE THAT THEY WILL BE REIMBURSED FOR THEIR EXPENSES. COUNCILMAN RAY AGREED THAT DUMPING IS AN ISSUE.

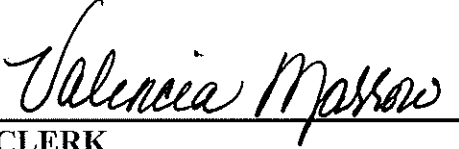
