REMARKS

COUNCILMAN HUGHES STATED THAT THIS LEGISLATION WAS DISCUSSED IN THE SAFETY COMMITTEE AND THE LAW DEPARTMENT WAS TO REPORT BACK TO THEM WITH SOME CLARIFICATION ON USING THIS MONEY. THE LAW DEPARTMENT DID NOT RESPOND TO THAT REQUEST. DURING THIS TIME OF HEIGHTENED AWARENESS AND PROTESTS OVER POLICE ACTIVITY, HE IS CONCERNED THAT THIS ORDINANCE IS TARGETING BLACK MALES. ALL OTHER TASK FORCES DEAL WITH PEOPLE WHO HAVE DONE ILLEGAL CRIMES. THIS LEGISLATION IS ABOUT FOLLOWING PEOPLE UNTIL THEY DO SOMETHING WRONG. THE LAW DEPARTMENT DID NOT GIVE THE SAFETY COMMITTEE THE INFORMATION THEY REQUESTED, AND HE FEELS IT IS DISINGENUOUS FOR IT TO HAVE COME TO COUNCIL.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS AGREED THAT IT IS TARGETING PEOPLE. SHE ADDED THAT THIS IS AN OVERTIME GRANT AND THE POLICE WILL BE REQUIRED TO PRODUCE AND STOP PEOPLE FOR INSIGNIFICANT INFRACTIONS. SHE STATED THAT THIS GRANT WILL BE FOCUSED ON THE SOUTH AND EAST SIDES OF YOUNGSTOWN, SO THE PEOPLE WHO WILL BE STOPPED AND TARGETED WILL MOST LIKELY BE BLACK PEOPLE FOR LOW LEVEL INFRACTIONS. THESE TYPES OF SPECIAL DETAILS NEED TO BE BROUGHT TO THE SAFETY COMMITTEE FOR FURTHER DISCUSSION.

COUNCILMAN OLIVER ASKED WHAT IS THE COURSE OF ACTION AT THIS POINT.

COUNCILMAN RAY STATED THAT SOMEONE COULD RESCIND THE MOTION.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS SHE WAS FINE GOING FORWARD WITH A VOTE.

PRESIDENT KITCHEN STATED THAT THE CLERK CAN CALL THE VOTE.

REMARKS

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS NOTED SHE WOULD LIKE TO EXPRESS HER CONCERNS ON THIS LEGISLATION. SHE STATED THAT THIS LEGISLATION WAS JUST PASSED JUNE 3, 2020, AND HERE WE ARE ON JULY 29, 2020 INCREASING IT BY ANOTHER \$200,000. SHE DOESN'T THINK WE SHOULD KEEP APPROVING MORE AND MORE EXPENSES. WHEN THIS WAS FIRST BROUGHT TO MEMBERS OF COUNCIL IT WAS AT \$250,000, AND IT IS NOW OVER \$450,000. SHE DOESN'T LIKE SPENDING THAT KIND OF MONEY ON A BICYCLE TRAIL, AND THEM COMING BACK OVER AND OVER TO REQUEST MORE MONEY, BECAUSE THEY FAILED TO ASSESS INITIALLY HOW MUCH THE PROJECT WOULD COST. SHE SAID WE OWE IT TO THE PUBLIC TO NOT GO INTO MORE DEBT.

COUNCILMAN RAY APPRECIATES COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS' VIEW ON THAT, BUT WE NEED TO LOOK AT THE LEVERAGE OUT OF THAT PROJECT, AS HE THINKS IT IS A SMALL INVESTMENT FOR WHAT WE ARE GETTING, AND HE THINKS IT IS WORTH IT.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER STATED ON JUNE 3, 2020 WE WERE ASKED FOR \$770,000 AND NOW FOR A \$202,000 INCREASE. SHE THINKS IT IS A GREAT PROJECT, BUT DOING BUSINESS THIS WAY IS NOT EFFICIENT.

REMARKS

COUNCILMAN OLIVER STATED HE HAD A QUESTION FOR THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S TARA CIOFFI. HE ASKED WHAT IS THE SCIENCE FOR FACE MASKS TO SLOW OR STOP THE SPREAD OF COVID-19.

MS. CIOFFI STATED THERE ARE SCIENTIFIC STUDIES THAT SAY THAT FACE MASKS HELP SLOW OR REDUCE THE SPREAD AND SHE CAN GET COUNCIL INFORMATION ON THAT. IT IS A LAYERED APPROACH, SO USING MASKS ALONG WITH SOCIAL DISTANCING AND SANITIZING. IT IS JUST ANOTHER PIECE TO HELP WITH PREVENTION. WE KNOW IT IS AEROSOLIZED, SO ANY PROTECTION CAN HELP PREVENT SPREAD TO THE NEXT PERSON. WE HAVE SEEN SPREAD IN CHOIR GROUPS AND SPORTING EVENTS WHERE THERE IS A LOT OF AEROSOLIZED SPREAD.

COUNCILMAN OLIVER STATED SO THE MASK WON'T STOP THE VIRUS, BUT IF YOU ARE SOCIALLY DISTANCED FROM A PERSON AND YOU ARE WEARING A MASK IT WILL SLOW IT.

MS. CIOFFI STATED THE VIRUS CAN GO THROUGH THE MASK, AND THE SOCIAL DISTANCE IS JUST AS KEY, BUT WORN PROPERLY ALONG WITH SPACING IT CAN HELP SLOW THE SPREAD.

COUNCILMAN OLIVER STATED BY PASSING THIS ORDINANCE WE ARE FORCING THE PUBLIC TO WEAR A MASK IN ORDER TO POTENTIALLY SLOW THE SPREAD.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS STATED THAT WEARING A MASK IS AKIN TO WEARING A CONDOM. WEARING A MASK IS EFFECTIVE BUT NOT 100%.

MS. CIOFFI AGREED WITH COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS' ANALOGY.

COUNCILWOMAN ADAMCZAK STATED THAT SHE FEELS IT IS IMPORTANT TO ENCOURAGE RESIDENTS TO WEAR MASKS BUT NOT MANDATE THEM. SHE DOESN'T WANT TO BURDEN THE YOUNGSTOWN POLICE DEPARTMENT WITH MANAGING THIS ISSUE. SHE DOESN'T FEEL AS A CITY THAT WE SHOULD MANDATE.

COUNCILMAN RAY STATED THE STATE ALREADY HAS A MANDATE OUT TO WEAR THEM.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ASKED THE MAYOR WHAT LED HIM TO PUT THE LEGISLATION FORTH, AND WHAT IS THE IMPORTANCE OF MANDATING MASKS.

MAYOR BROWN STATED THIS IS A RESULT OF CONVERSATIONS WITH THE OHIO DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH. OTHER OHIO CITIES SUCH AS CINCINNATI AND DAYTON, WHO WERE IN RED, SAW A REDUCTION WHEN THEY MANDATED MASKS. THE MASKS ARE ANOTHER LAYER OF PROTECTION TO FIGHT COVID. IF YOU HAVE A MASK ON AND SNEEZE, IT HELPS SLOW THE SPREAD. IT IS FOR OTHERS YOU WANT TO PROTECT AGAINST. THE MANDATE IS ALREADY AT THE STATE LEVEL, AND HE JUST WANTS COUNCIL TO STAND WITH THE GOVERNOR ON THIS MANDATE.

COUNCILWOMAN ADAMCZAK STATED SHE WOULD SUPPORT IT IF IT WAS A RESOLUTION. THIS LEGISLATION HAS A LOT OF OMISSIONS, SUCH AS CHILDREN, WHO CAN BE CARRIERS.

COUNCILWOMAN TURNER ASKED WHAT OUR CURRENT NUMBERS ARE, AND WHAT IS THE CLIMATE FROM 2 WEEKS AGO TO NOW.

MS. CIOFFI RESPONDED THAT IN YOUNGSTOWN WE HAVE 646 CASES, WITH 89 HOSPITALIZATIONS AND 40 DEATHS AND THAT HAS BEEN PRETTY CONSTANT FOR THE LAST FEW DAYS. OF 750 PEOPLE TESTED AT THE POP-UP SITE CONDUCTED BY THE NATIONAL GUARD, THERE WERE 28 POSITIVES. THERE IS A LOT OF TESTING GOING ON EVERYWHERE, SO THE TESTS ARE THERE, BUT LABS ARE OVERWHELMED DUE TO ALL THE TESTING. THE STATE IS TRYING TO GET MORE LABS SET UP. THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT RECEIVED ABOUT 15 COMPLAINTS FOR NOT WEARING MASKS, AT CONVENIENT STORES OR GAS STATIONS MOSTLY. HER DEPARTMENT DROPPED OFF MASKS AT MANY LOCATIONS, SO THE FACILITIES CAN PROVIDE THEM SO THERE ISN'T ANY CONFRONTATION. THEY DON'T WANT POLICE TO HAVE TO RESPOND, THE HEALTH DEPARTMENT HAS BEEN RESPONDING. THROUGH TRACING, THEY HAVE BEEN SEEING POSITIVES THROUGH MASS GATHERINGS, RESTAURANTS AND BARS. THEY DON'T WANT TO HAVE TO CLOSE THESE ESTABLISHMENTS, AND THEY DON'T WANT TO SEE SPREAD.

COUNCILWOMAN DAVIS STATED THAT IF WEARING A MASK CAN PREVENT ONE FUTURE DEATH IT IS WORTH IT. THIS LEGISLATION DOESN'T REQUIRE THE POLICE TO GIVE A CITATION OR TICKET, THEY CAN JUST TELL THE PERSON THEY NEED TO PUT ON A MASK. OUR CITY ORDINANCES PARALLEL OUR STATE ORDINANCES. THERE IS A DOLLAR REASON AS TO WHY THEY CHARGE UNDER THE STATE LAW NOW. SO THE FACT THAT THIS LEGISLATION MIRRORS THE STATE ISN'T A REASON TO NOT PASS IT.

COUNCILMAN OLIVER STATED THAT ACROSS THE NATION WE HAVE SEEN SHERIFFS AND POLICE DEPARTMENTS SAYING THEY WON'T ENFORCE A MASK

MANDATE, AND IT WOULD BE VERY TEDIOUS TO PATROL. SINCE IT IS ALREADY AT THE STATE LEVEL, HOW ARE WE GOING TO ENFORCE THIS AS A CITY? IF A POLICE OFFICER ASKS SOMEONE TO WEAR A MASK AND THEY REFUSE, WHAT HAPPENS?

MAYOR BROWN STATED WE HAVE BEEN DEALING WITH THIS PANDEMIC SINCE MARCH. OUR LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT HAS BEEN DEALING WITH MASS GATHERINGS, AND ONCE THEY FIND AN ISSUE, THEY WILL GIVE A WARNING AND EVEN WILL OFFER MASKS TO PEOPLE. IT IS ABOUT WARNING, EDUCATION AND NOT A PENALTY FIRST.

THE ORDINANCE WAS THEN PLACED BEFORE COUNCIL AND PASSED BY A VOTE OF YEAS, 4. NAYS, 3.

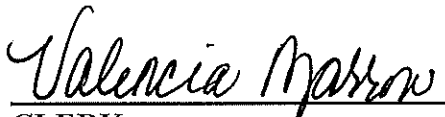

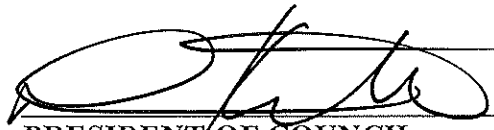
