WHEN IT RAINS, IT DRAINS!

When we use water in our homes, it goes down the drain and gets treated at a treatment plant before being released into the environment. But when water goes down storm drains, it flows directly to rivers and streams, carrying pollutants with it.

Your lawn may be a source of water pollution! Keep these things in mind when maintaining lawns and gardens:



FERTILIZERS & PESTICIDES

- Kill plants and good bacteria if they enter rivers & streams.
- Only apply them when it's not going to rain! Minimize use when you can.



YARD WASTE

- Clogs and floods storm drains.
- Nutrients can cause algal blooms.
- Rake, bag, and dispose of yard waste and other litter!



PET WASTE

- May contain E. coli and other pathogens, which can cause health problems for humans and other creatures.
- Bag it up and throw it away!
