CLEAN PARKS, CLEAN WATER, CLEAN PAWS, CLEAN SHOES

- Leaving dog poop on the ground can transmit disease to other dogs and humans. It can also spread Salmonella, E. coli, roundworms and hookworms to children and adults who share the grass.
- Unscooped dog poop washes off into the waterways and provides nutrients (pollutants) that may cause algae blooms and fish kills. Stormwater runoff may become your drinking water.





Please clean up after your pet. Place dog poop in a trash receptacle, not in a storm drain.
