Youngstown Water Boil Advisory Lifted for All Impacted Customers

Youngstown, OH – The boil advisory issued February 1, 2026, for Youngstown Water customers has been lifted for all customers.

As required by the Ohio EPA, the boil advisory was issued after a water main break on Hubbard Road between Logan and Albert Street caused depressurization in a significant portion of the impacted cities. Water pressure was restored by Monday, February 2, at 3 pm.

At 1:51 pm today, February 4, 2026, Youngstown Water Department received results from the water samples taken Monday, February 2 and Tuesday February 3 from 64 locations in the advisory area. The results showed **NO** pathogens were present in any sample. **The water is safe to drink and use as normal.**

For the next few days, customers may experience cloudy water at their tap which clears from the bottom of a glass to the top. The cloudiness is caused by extra air in the distribution system and premise plumbing. **The water is safe to drink.** Performing a 5-minute full-house flush of all cold-water faucets, tubs and showers at the same time with aerator screens off may help clear the cloudiness.
