Youngstown Police Department to Implement New Schools in Traffic Safety Program

The Youngstown Police Department will begin an Automated Traffic Enforcement Speed Device program at seven (7) additional schools.

On Tuesday April 25th, we will start the initial 30-day warning period on seven (7) new schools. During this 30-day warning period, violators will receive a warning in the mail that carries no fine. After the warning period has expired, violators will receive a citation in the mail. This violation is a civil violation and is not considered a traffic violation. You will not receive points on your driver's license, and it will not be reported to your insurance. The automated speed zone will only be enforced on school days.

- Cardinal Mooney High School on Erie St. - Enforcement starts at 7:00 AM - 6:00 PM
- Potential Development on Market St. - Enforcement starts at 7:00 AM - 6:00 PM
- Taft Elementary School on Gibson St. - Enforcement starts at 7:30 AM - 6:00 PM
- Youngstown Academy of Excellence on Rigby and S. Jackson St. - Enforcement starts at 7:00 AM - 6:00 PM
- Harding Elementary School on Benita and Cordova Ave - Enforcement starts at 7:15 AM - 6:00 PM
- Ursuline High School on Wick Ave. - Enforcement starts at 6:30 AM - 6:00 PM
- Youngstown Early College on Wick Ave and Wood St- Enforcement starts at 6:15 AM - 6:00 PM

Restricted 20 MPH times are posted on a sign before entering every school zone. During non-restricted times, the regularly posted speed limit will be photo enforced when school is in session and children are present until 6:00 PM.

The 30-day warning period for these new zones will run from April 25th and for 30 days. We're committed to safeguarding our kids with this innovative initiative. Please drive safely in our school zones and in our community.
