

SOUTH AVENUE BRIDGE REHABILITATION • PID 117081

Public Comment Period: May 14, 2024 – June 14, 2024

About the Project

The City of Youngstown Department of Public Works proposes to rehabilitate the South Avenue bridge over the Y&S Railroad between Dorothy Avenue and Marion Avenue. The work is needed to address problems with the existing bridge and improve safety for vehicles and pedestrians. When complete, the bridge will have the same number of traffic lanes and sidewalks on both sides.

Construction Schedule

Construction is scheduled for the Summer of 2025 and will be complete by the end of 2025. During construction, South Avenue will be closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic for a maximum of 180 consecutive calendar days. Detours will be posted at least 2 weeks before construction begins. Access will be maintained to all adjacent properties, residences, businesses, and intersecting side streets, including South Side Park and the South Side Veterans Memorial for the duration of the project.

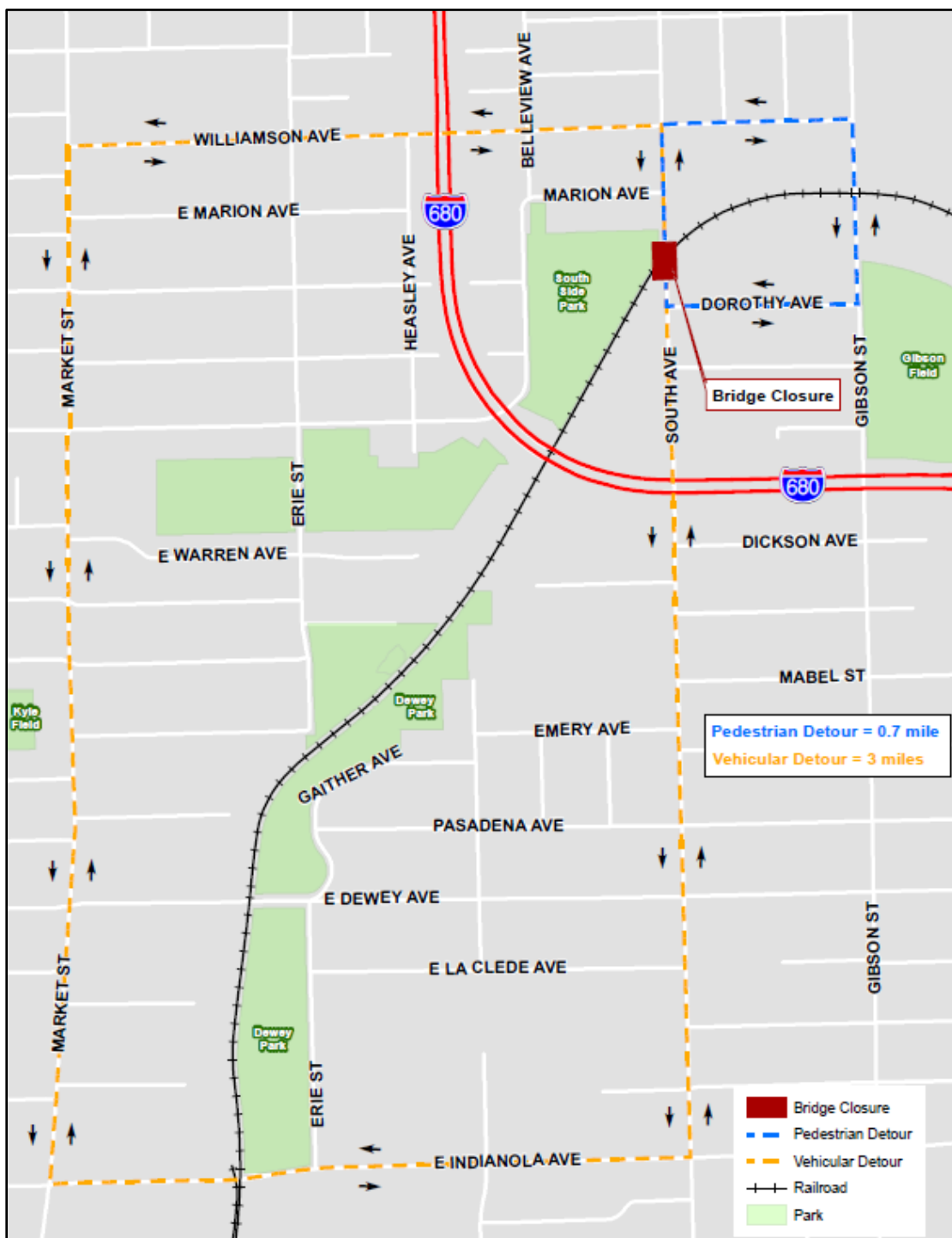
Signed Detour Routes

Vehicle: Williamson Avenue, Market St, Indianola Avenue, and South Avenue, a total distance of 3 miles.

Pedestrian: Williamson Avenue, Gibson Street, Dorothy Avenue, and South Avenue, a total distance of 0.7 mile.

Project Impacts

There will be temporary impacts to some nearby properties during construction. Access will be maintained to all properties, including South Side Park and the South Side Veterans Memorial during this time.
